COVID-19 - WEEKLY CHECK IN LOG #10 May 20, 2020 Summary

Invited participants: Sector calls

OBA, FOLA, LSO, LAO, the Advocates' Society, & OTLA Superior Court of Justices in Ontario, Court of Appeal for Ontario, & Ontario Court of Justice MAG - Political and Department staff

Issues discussed:

1. Courts

- ❖ The SCJ is now operating under the consolidated practice direction issued last week (<u>available here</u>) and they expect to operate under those directives for the next 5-6 weeks while MAG decides on an e-Filing system (currently in the procurement process).
- ❖ Both the SCJ and the OCJ continue to work with the various Task Forces (Family, Civil, Criminal, Bankruptcy, and Small Claims) as well as the e-Hearings Task Force to review processes and procedures related to adding new matters to the Courts' operations.
- ❖ The OCJ has issued a new notice regarding Provincial Offences Act Matters (<u>available here</u>) as well as a new directive for public and media access (<u>available here</u>).
- ❖ The OCJ is in the process of drafting a new notice related to Criminal Matters, which we can expect early next week.
- ❖ MAG and the OCJ are exploring ways of piloting video conferencing in jails (perhaps using the Toronto East Detention Centre).
- The Courts continue to work with all working groups (FAST Action, e-Task Force, and others) and are in the process of drafting e-Filing conventions once the e-Filing platform is rolled out.

2. LSO

❖ The Law Society is requesting that members of the public who wish to watch future Convocations to fill out a form as online attendance will be limited. This process will last until Convocation begins to meet again in person. You can download the form here.
